Report on the Standalone Ind AS Financial Statements

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying Standalone Ind AS financial statements of *M/s. Pagel Concrete Technologies Private Limited ("the Company")*, which comprise the Balance Sheet as at **31st March, 2025**, the Statement of Profit and Loss (including Other comprehensive Income) the Cash Flow Statement and the statement of changes in the Equity for the year then ended and a summary of the significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

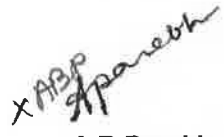

1. SUMMARY OF MATERIAL ACCOUNTING POLICIES

a. Basis of the accounting :

The financial statements of the Company have been prepared in accordance with the Indian Accounting Standards (Ind AS) prescribed under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 ('Act') read with Rule 3 of the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015 and the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Amendment Rules, 2016.

b. Property, Plant and Equipment :
